Executive Overview

Dear Friends,

Katrina. Rita. Wilma. Three of the 28 named storms that tested our resolve during the past year. 2005 was the most active hurricane season on record. Fifteen storms became hurricanes. Four major hurricanes struck the United States for the first time ever. New England responded immediately. Together we displayed boundless compassion and generosity toward those impacted by the hurricanes. More than 1,000 families displaced by Hurricane Katrina came to our offices in Boston. Our local response was most evident by Operation Helping Hand. Led by Governor Mitt Romney, this collaboration helped hundreds of evacuees who had been airlifted to Camp Edwards on Cape Cod. Through the support of people across the country like you, the American Red Cross helped more than 1.4 million families nationwide with emergency assistance.

As storm after storm impacted our area, families turned to the Red Cross for help. When a weakened dam threatened to destroy part of Taunton, we were called into action. In May, after heavy rainfall triggered the worst flooding in New England in nearly 70 years, over 500 people sought safety in Red Cross shelters across our state. Each night in Massachusetts, when house fires force families to flee their homes, Red Cross volunteers responded and provided emergency assistance.

In addition to responding to these devastating incidents, we also played a significant leadership role in assuring that our region is ready and prepared as possible. The Red Cross worked as a partner to the City of Boston to provide emergency supplies and information to residents. With support from Mayor Thomas M. Menino and the City of Boston, 10,000 income-eligible individuals received Red Cross disaster supply kits and we provided preparedness training and community disaster education for Boston's neighborhood organizations. Across the other 127 cities and towns in our jurisdiction, we expanded partnerships with emergency management agencies and responders and grew our corps of volunteer community liaisons to bring us closer to local decision makers.

The chapter closes its fiscal year on solid ground yet mindful of the goals and challenges in front of us. This fall the American Red Cross of Massachusetts Bay opens its new headquarters in Kendall Square, Cambridge. This move is a strategic investment in our future which will help to strengthen our commitment to community preparedness and disaster response. We are building upon existing collaborations, renewing commitments, engaging donors and growing our financial base. Through your support, we are ready to be there. Thank you.

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE

- *Responded to 396 local incidents*
- *Assisted 2,324 individuals*
- *Provided \$400,000 in financial assistance*
- *Educated through community outreach 61,759 people*

When a disaster threatens or strikes, Red Cross relief teams provide on-site and follow-up disaster assistance by helping clients with a place to stay, food to eat, necessary medication or health items, clothes to wear and mental health services to address their basic human needs, recover from the disaster and resume their normal daily activities. The American Red Cross teaches individuals, families, businesses, places of worship, community groups, and students how to prevent, prepare for, mitigate and respond to disasters. Through presentations, community partnerships and events, Red Cross teaches the importance of understanding our region's vulnerabilities and the steps needed to prepare for emergencies.

HEALTH AND SAFETY TRAINING

- *Trained 103,727 people*
- *43,744 in lifeguarding and water safety*
- *5,506 in other health-related courses*
- *54,477 in CPR and First Aid*

American Red Cross Preparedness programs help people lead safer and healthier lives. Our training programs are developed in conjunction with leading medical authorities and the American Red Cross name and emblem carry a guarantee of quality, trust and reliability.

HEALTH CARE JOB TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION

The Massachusetts Bay Red Cross chapter is the largest provider in the region for training nurse assistants and home health aides. Through a contract with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, it is the state's sole testing and certification agency for Nurse Aides and Medication Administration. The paraprofessionals we train play a key role in the daily care of the elderly and infirmed.

HUNGER RELIEF

Locally, the Red Cross is a key provider in the region's hunger relief system, operating food pantries in Boston, East Boston, Melrose, New Bedford and Waltham. In addition, the local Red Cross is a leader in bulk food collection and distribution through *Food Drive for the Hungry*, a food transportation program operated collaboratively with *Project Bread*.

INTERNATIONAL SOCIAL SERVICES/ARMED FORCES EMERGENCY SERVICES
